

PHYSICAL ASSESSMENT FOR THE OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH NURSE

SUMMARY OF TOPICS

Strains, Sprains and Common Musculoskeletal Injuries

Small and large joint musculoskeletal injuries commonly found in occupational health settings will be discussed.

Head, Ears, Eyes, Nose and Throat

HEENT structures, findings and examinations, along with chronic, urgent and emergent conditions will be covered.

Head Injuries

Current assessment, treatment and evaluation guidelines for brain contusion and concussion will be covered.

Dermatological Trauma: Lacerations, Thermal and Chemical Injuries

Current assessment, treatment and evaluation guidelines for the management of selected dermatological traumas will be discussed.

Chest Pain: Sorting Through the Diagnostic Picture

Comparing and contrasting emergent and non-emergent chest discomfort in the occupational health setting will be discussed. Subsequent management guidelines will be reviewed.

Respiratory Ailments

Current management practices and medical guidelines in selected common occupational health respiratory conditions will be covered.

OBJECTIVES

Following the program, the attendee should be able to: collect a client history specific to occupational health issues; skillfully perform a focused physical examination; implement advanced physical assessment maneuvers to clarify abnormal findings; recognize and differentiate abnormal findings associated with common conditions; synthesize subjective and objective knowledge in the formulation of physical diagnosis; demonstrate competence in the written documentation of health assessments; and identify emergent and urgent findings that warrant immediate referral or consultation.
