

One of my father's many talents was being an avid social dancer, and he exposed me to various dance forms. As my confidence and motivation grew with dance, I realized its many beneficial social aspects, health, and fitness contributions at high risk or living with a chronic disease. As for all individuals and athletes. This interest led me to take tap dance lessons, flamenco dance lessons, and basic ballet classes at the Pittsburgh Ballet Company- a truly humbling experience. A highlight of my experiences was the fortunate opportunity to meet and watch the late great tap dancer Gregory Hines perform.
